The cup of peace

Such tension is alive between the violence of the vineyard parable from Matthew 21 and the hope of our celebration of Communion this day. Jesus has told of the vineyard where those who are sent by the owner are confronted by violent tenants. The people, upon hearing about the mistreatment and abuse, respond instinctively that, of course, the owner will throw out these tenants and find others who will behave differently. At that Jesus reminds them (and us) of the words given by the Hebrew prophets: the stone once rejected becomes the cornerstone.

But what Jesus says next, is what we might need to be reminded of often: "The kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a people that produces the fruits of the kingdom."

Jesus has become our cornerstone.

On this day, when we know that right hands will be open and extended to receive Jesus' cup of peace and bread of life, we proclaim this in an act of worldwide Communion. All sorts of hands will reach out, from many hours before we find ourselves in worship until long after our day has ended in sleep.

The great hope of this celebration is that through God, the example of Jesus, and the movement of the Spirit all these people—in all their differing opinions, ways of being, and practices—can strive together to produce the fruits of the kingdom.

We can choose to drink from the cup of peace and be fed by the bread of life that Jesus extends to us. Or we can be the violent tenants of the vineyard, making our way *the* way, who cannot hear the servants of the landowner and misunderstand God's desire for reconciliation.

May we act with the peace and love demonstrated by the community of Christ around our globe this day, in every day we live.
